PEACH STATE HEALTH PLAN



Peach State Health Plan provides health care services to families through the PeachCare for Kids® Program. We offer all the services PeachCare for Kids® provides and more.

Complete Medical Care. Get health benefits for you and your family.

Dental and Vision Benefits Care for teeth and eyes with exams and other services. Receive \$100 to use for glasses, contact lenses, or broken frames.

My Health Pays Rewards Complete healthy activities and earn up to \$500 in rewards. *

Active and Healthy Kids Help kids learn new skills. Get a \$50 Sports Scholarship for activity fees and uniform costs. Plus, free memberships to Boys & Girls Club and Girl Scouts (participating locations).

Get Fit Rewards Focus on your health Get a free membership to a participating gym or join Weight Watchers® (\$300 value). Plus, receive free fitness supplies. *

Mobile Market Get healthy foods like fruit, snacks, and vegetables. Plus, get meal planning kits at select community events (\$25 value).

Pregnant and New Moms Join our Start Smart for Your Baby® program for you and your baby. Earn up to \$95 in rewards. At special baby shower events, receive free diapers and a breast pump or baby monitor.

Special Family Care Programs Receive up to \$125 per year for childcare. * Free member perks program for restaurants, movie tickets, and more. Free SAT and ACT guides (up to \$150 value) and GED tests (up to \$200 value).

*Rewards are for eligible and qualified members.

AFFORDABLE CARE ACT



The Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act—commonly referred to as the Affordable Care Act (ACA) and also known as Obamacare—includes more than 1,000 pages of provisions intended to make coverage affordable for and accessible to millions of Americans who struggled to pay for individual coverage. Many of these people could not buy individual coverage at any price due to pre-existing medical conditions.

All plans cover:

- Ambulatory patient services (outpatient care you get without being admitted to a hospital)
- Emergency services
- Hospitalization (like surgery and overnight stays)
- Pregnancy, maternity, and newborn care (both before and after birth)
- Mental health and substance use disorder services, including behavioral health treatment (this includes counseling and psychotherapy)
- Prescription drugs
- Rehabilitative and habilitative services and devices (services and devices to help people with injuries, disabilities, or chronic conditions gain or recover mental and physical skills)
- Laboratory services
- Preventive and wellness services and chronic disease management
- Pediatric services, including oral and vision care (but adult dental and vision coverage aren't essential health benefits)

GA WIC PROGRAM



The Women, Infants, and Children Nutrition Program (WIC) is a special nutrition program that provides nutritional education, food supplements, and referrals to health care providers to eligible women, infants, and children.

How to Qualify

WIC is generally available to:

- low-income pregnant, breastfeeding, and postpartum women
- low-income parent or guardian who is the sole provider of children under age five who are at nutritional risk and who are at or below 185 percent of the federal poverty level

You can learn more about WIC and take the WIC Eligibility Assessment to see if you qualify* or contact your local WIC office to make an appointment and find out which documents you will need to bring with you. (To find your local WIC agency use the clinic listing) At your appointment, WIC staff will check to see if you and your family qualify).

WIC Provides

- Special checks to buy healthy foods from WIC-authorized vendors – milk, eggs, bread, cereal, juice, peanut butter, and much more (see Authorized Foods)
- Information about nutrition and health to help you and your family eat well and be healthy
- Support and information about breastfeeding your baby
- Help in finding health care and other community services
