Individual Consultations are available with peer and professional writing tutors to support projects across disciplines, including course papers, dissertation chapters, conference proposals, articles, teaching materials, applications, and more.

Dissertation Boot Camps are hosted several times each year to empower participants' goal setting and writing in a supportive environment.

Weekly Writing Groups are co-hosted with the LGS English Language Support Program. Participants meet with fellow graduate students for two hours of writing sprints, making progress on their writing projects within a supportive community.

Employment and Fellowship Opportunities are offered by the Writing Center. Dissertation completion fellowships are available each year, and hourly writing tutor positions open on a rolling basis. These provide opportunities for LGS students to professionalize as an educator and mentor.
