Individual Consultations are available with advanced graduate students, and Writing Program Faculty are available for appointments to support a range of projects including course papers, dissertation chapters, conference proposals, articles, and more.

Dissertation Boot Camps are hosted several times throughout the year to empower participants' goal-setting and writing in a supportive environment.

Weekly Writing Group are co-hosted with the LGS English Language Support Program. Quiet writing time is held for the first hour and a writing discussion for those who stay for a second hour.

Individualized Consultations with Teaching Materials enable students to meet with advanced graduate students and Writing Program Faculty to discuss creating meaningful learning outcomes and syllabus crafting.

Fellowship Opportunities are offered by the Writing Center. Three advanced fellowships for LGS students are available each year, providing opportunities to grow as an educator and build out CV experience.
